

CHILD CARE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

FOR ONONDAGA
COUNTY RESIDENTS

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Families with a household income up to 275% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) may be eligible for child care subsidies through Onondaga County's Child Care Services. The subsidy covers most (and sometimes all) of the cost of care.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Families with household incomes up to 275% FPL may qualify. Example: a family of four earning up to \$76,313.

HOW MUCH DO I PAY?

Families share is limited to **1%**. Example: a family of four pays no more than \$485.63/year.
